

## **Section 106 Applicant Toolkit Checklist**

## Remember, as an Applicant you will need to:

	Define the undertaking and all its component parts clearly, including
	other federal involvement.
	Clarify environmental reviews required for the undertaking, and define
	the applicant's role.
	Determine the extent and scope of public participation.
	Determine if there are agency policies and procedures for involving the
	applicant in environmental reviews.
	Collaborate with agency to identify stakeholders.
	Convene a meeting with consulting parties to describe the undertaking,
	project schedule and milestones, and how stakeholders will be engaged.
	Verify that the applicant understands how the APE has been defined.
	Determine the role of the applicant in the identification and evaluation
	of historic properties (development of scope of work, use of contractors
	cost, timing, document preparation).
	Clarify how the applicant will be involved in the assessment of effects on
	historic properties.
	Clarify the applicant's role in the analysis of alternatives, particularly
	those that avoid adverse effects.
	Participate in resolution of adverse effects and negotiation of
	agreement document.
	Discuss with consulting parties the role the applicant will assume in
	implementing agreement documents.

Since Section 106 consultation is a dynamic process, the consulting parties may determine that additional information beyond this checklist may be appropriate.
